



"Ozio has its oun virtue: it was designed especially to conform ti the human body. Now sofas can go back to being sofas and man can go back to being man. Comfortable at last!" Busnelli unveiled is new Ozio sofa at the Milan Furniture Fair: The name means languor and the concept it utmost comfort for the main seating area in the home. Its design marries form and function, mindful of th purpose the object is supposed to fill. A concept that seemed virtually forgotten while the banner of research and innovation flourished. Times change, people change and finally, someone realised that catering to individuals whose statures lie beyond national average height and weight charts might be an interesting undertaking from a commercial prospective.

So, Ottagono proposed to test out the range of new sofas and chairs presented at the Fair "on the field" to draw marked attention not only to the design but also to comfort. Ozio seemed the perfect place to star and ranked high in our extemporaneous classification. Some of its pluses are the backrest that gently curves to offer the healthiest seat-to-backrest inclination, its overall firmness and the innovative feet where the two front feet are twice as high as the rear feet. All this benefits the percentile scale and enables a wider range of body types to stretch out or sit upright, providing a comfortable position without having to use extensions or drop back mechanisms. One sofa that uses such a machanical device is Pascal Mourque's "mausse" sofa, Lover, where the upper section of the backrest
